- 3 Societal impacts: both positive and negative.

Lasers, LED's, glow sticks, fluorescent lights, phosphorescent lights

Technological devices related to PROPERTIES OF LIGHT:

Microscopes, solar ovens, camera, retroreflectors, fibre optics, laser surgery (in general), binoculars, Security mirrors (convenience stores)

Technological device/procedure related to HUMAN PERCEPTION OF LIGHT:

Eye glasses, contact lenses, low light vision sensors, laser eye surgery, coloured filters for dyslexia, Polaroid sun glasses.

Author's last name, initial. (Date of print publication: year, month, day). <u>Title of Encyclopedia/newspaper/magazine</u>, Volume number, page numbers. If online – retrieval date (month/date/year)
